Youth Subcultures in Fiction, Film and Other Media Feb 26 2020 This collection explores the representation, articulation and construction of youth subcultures in a range of texts and contexts. It brings together scholars working in literary studies, screen studies, sociology and cultural studies whose research interests lie in the aesthetics and cultural politics of youth. It contributes to, and extends, contemporary theoretical perspectives around youth and youth cultures. Contributors examine a range of topics, including 'bad girl' fiction of the 1950s, novels by subcultural writers such as Colin MacInnes, Alex Wheatle and Courttia Newland, as well as screen representations of Mods, the 1990s Rave culture, heavy metal, and the Manchester scene. Others explore interventions into subcultural theory with respect to metal, subcultural locations, abjection, graffiti cultures, and the potential of subcultures to resist dominant power frameworks in both historical and contemporary contexts.

Popular Postcolonialisms Sep 15 2021 Drawing together the insights of postcolonial scholarship and cultural studies, *Popular Postcolonialisms* questions the place of 'the popular' in the postcolonial paradigm. Multidisciplinary in focus, this collection

explores the extent to which popular forms are infused with colonial logics, and whether they can be employed by those advocating for change. It considers a range of fiction, film, and non-hegemonic cultural forms, engaging with topics such as environmental change, language activism, and cultural imperialism alongside analysis of figures like Tarzan and Frankenstein. Building on the work of cultural theorists, it asks whether the popular is actually where elite conceptions of the world may best be challenged. It also addresses middlebrow cultural production, which has tended to be seen as antithetical to radical traditions, asking whether this might, in fact, form an unlikely realm from which to question, critique, or challenge colonial tropes. Examining the ways in which the imprint of colonial history is in evidence (interrogated, mythologized or sublimated) within popular cultural production, this book raises a series of speculative questions exploring the interrelation of the popular and the postcolonial.

The pubs of Fitzrovia where the painters Augustus John and Nina Hamnett rubbed shoulders with the occultist Aleister Crowley and the short-story writer Julian Maclaren-Ross, wearing mirror sunglasses and clutching a silver-topped Malacca cane, held court for his acolytes and admirers. The story of Bohemian London is one of drink and drugs, sex and death, excess and indulgence. It's also a story of achievement and success. Some of the finest art and literature of the last two centuries has emerged from Bohemia. Nick Rennison's book provides a lively and enjoyable portrait of the world in which Bohemian Londoners once lived. [Songbooks](#) Mar 09 2021 In *Songbooks*, critic and scholar Eric Weisbard offers a critical guide to books on American popular music from William Billings's 1770 *New-England Psalm-Singer* to Jay-Z's 2010 memoir *Decoded*. Drawing on his background editing the *Village Voice* music section, coediting the *Journal of Popular Music Studies*, and organizing the Pop Conference, Weisbard connects American music writing from memoirs, biographies, and song compilations to blues novels, magazine essays, and academic studies. The authors of these works are as diverse as the music itself: women, people of color, queer writers, self-educated scholars, poets, musicians, and elites discarding

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their social norms. Whether analyzing books on Louis Armstrong, the Beatles, and Madonna; the novels of Theodore Dreiser, Gayl Jones, and Jennifer Egan; or varying takes on blackface minstrelsy, Weisbard charts an alternative history of American music as told through its writing. As Weisbard demonstrates, the most enduring work pursues questions that linger across time period and genre—cultural studies in the form of notes on the fly, on sounds that never cease to change meaning.

"Hunger for place" Oct 24 2019 London spielt in einigen neueren Romanen eine bedeutende Rolle. Die exemplarische Analyse von sieben Werken geht vom Raum aus, der neben Zeit, Charakter und Handlung als konstituierendes Element der epischen Situation gesehen wird. Funktion und Wirkungsweise räumlicher Darstellung lassen sich so präzise aufzeigen. Drei situative Konstellationen erweisen sich dabei für den untersuchten Zeitraum als besonders typisch: Die Reaktion auf die kriegsbedingten Veränderungen im Stadtraum, die Konfrontation des in der Stadt Heranwachsenden mit seiner Umgebung sowie schließlich der Versuch, einer hinter den Fassaden verborgenen, imaginären Stadtdimension näher zu kommen. Die Einbeziehung des zeitgeschichtlichen Hintergrundes und der Verweis auf andere Romane läßt ein Panorama großstädtischer Erlebnismotive am Schnittpunkt von Realität und Fiktion entstehen.
